Liberty's "Joy Station" Condos Coming to Mount Joy



Markham has approved the site plan application for Phase 1 of a 2 phase project which will consist of two 22 storey mixed use buildings in an L-shaped configuration at Markham Road and Castlemore Avenue. This phase will include a total of 524 apartment units and 12 townhouses. There will be a 7-storey podium linking

both buildings. The future Phase 2 portion will have frontage on Castlemore Avenue and is awaiting the outcome of the Mount Joy Secondary Plan. Future development applications will be required to permit the Phase 2 development.

Styrofoam packaging is the plastic material used to protect large items such as appliances, household electronics, and furniture.

Styrofoam is recyclable but not in Markham's blue box program. By collecting it at the depots, we ensure it is responsibly processed and recycled into new products.

I'm looking forward to working alongside Parks Canada and other stakeholders on this project of national significance.
